Glandular Sources

Do you know where your glandulars are coming from? Do they contain antibiotics, hormones, pesticides or heavy metals? If they are from anywhere other than Denmark, the answer is probably yes.



We source all glands (with the exception of thyroid) from Denmark. This is the only country that has been antibiotic and growth-hormone free for all bovine and porcine glands since 1998. This means that the glands in our products are pure, untreated, and retain the best balance of naturally occurring hormones available.

The following excerpt is from the Danish Agriculture and Food Council.

Every year, more than 20,000 samples are taken for analysis for the presence of any unwanted residues of antibiotics, hormones, pesticides and heavy metals in Danish pig meat. This level of sampling is significantly higher than that required by EU legislation.

Since 1991, residues of antibiotics have been detected in less than 0.05% of samples analyzed. Residues of hormones have not been detected at all over the last 15 years. Likewise, no residues of pesticides or PCBs above the permitted level (MRL) have been found and only a single sample (in 1990) revealed an excess concentration of heavy metals.

The thyroid we use is sourced from New Zealand, which is also well respected for purity. Both Denmark and New Zealand are listed as negligible or very unlikely by the EU for sources of BSE.
